**Adopting the City of Superior and UW-Superior Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan Update**

WHEREAS, the City of Superior recognizes the threat that natural hazards pose to people and property; and

WHEREAS, undertaking hazard mitigation actions before disasters occur will reduce the potential for harm to people and property and save taxpayer dollars; and

WHEREAS, an adopted multi-hazard mitigation plan is required as a condition of future funding for mitigation projects under multiple Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) pre- and post- disaster mitigation grant programs; and

WHEREAS, FEMA requires that communities update hazard mitigation plans every five years in order to be eligible for the full range of pre-disaster and post-disaster federal funding for mitigation purposes; and





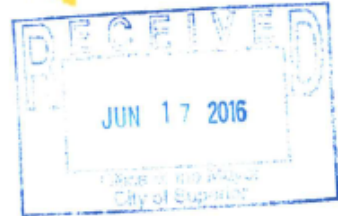

Dear Mayor Hagen:

In September 2005, the University of Wisconsin System office of environmental affairs recommended that individual campuses either develop an All Hazard Mitigation Plan or adopt a city or county plan, if available, in order to become eligible for FEMA Pre-Disaster mitigation grant funding opportunities addressing natural hazards. In 2010, the campus adopted the city of Superior's All Hazard Mitigation Plan, including section 10 which outlines general mitigation strategies for the University. In July 2015, members of the University including Carol Lindberg, Environmental Health and Safety, Dusty Johnson, Director of Facilities and Georgette Koenig, VC-Administration & Finance were invited to participate in the review and revision of the city of Superior's All Hazard Mitigation Plan strategies.
