Business by City Attorney Prell:

1. City Attorney Frog Prell to introduce Attorney Seth Meyer from the Keller / Lenkner law firm, to present an overview of the opioid epidemic and its toll on municipalities. Attorney Lenkner will present theories of law under which he contends opioid manufacturers and distributors may be held accountable for damages and will describe litigation efforts his firm intends to make on behalf of Superior and other municipalities.

Business by Mayor Jim Paine:

2. Mayor Paine will ask the council to authorize execution of a retainer agreement with Keller / Lenkner law firm to initiate a formal lawsuit, on the behalf of the city, against certain opioid manufacturers and distributors.
